

Homo Interrogans John Bruin, 2001-02-22 Emerging from the Brentano Husserl tradition this volume charts new ground in the conceptual discourse of questioning and answering John Bruin examines the logic of interrogation and makes the case that intentionality itself has the structure of question and answer Here he breaks rank with the better known and more traditional and sets out to explore questioning from a phenomenological perspective Published in English the Other Matthew Rukgaber, 2025-02-20 Philosophical anthropology investigates what makes us human but it has produced accounts that exclude some members of our species It relies often on non naturalistic philosophies of consciousness that locate humanity in the cognitive capacity to objectively represent things to reason teleologically and use tools to use symbols and language or to be self conscious and question existence This work pursues an alternative thoroughly naturalistic philosophical anthropology by combining Arnold Gehlen's theory of our behaviorally detached and institutionally structured impulses with Maurice Merleau Ponty s views on intersubjectivity affect sexuality and social institutions It locates the human within the unique structure of our capacity for feeling which produces an inclusive account of the human as the other or Homo alter Humans are deeply and thoroughly dependent on affective bodily communicative bonds in which other humans appear as sources of pleasure communicative meaning institutional norms and interpersonal approbation and disapprobation However this socio biological account of the human denies that human nature alone can prescribe the necessary form of institutions such as the home which is a criticism of any potential political anthropology A result of this focus on our social and affective natures is a novel account of shame as a response to institutional and interpersonal exclusion Failing to recognize humanity within our dependency on others and the structure of feeling is a widespread problem in philosophy and society in general that contributes to the social and metaphysical exclusion of disabled persons who might lack certain forms of consciousness and cognition Reimagining philosophical anthropology as the study of the unique way that human beings are socially present to one another this work challenges such dehumanization Rethinking Fundamental Theology Gerald O'Collins, 2011-05-27 This book identifies the distinguishing features of fundamental theology as distinct from philosophical theology natural theology apologetics and other similar disciplines Addressing the potential for confusion about basic Christian claims and beliefs Gerald O Collins sets out to relaunch fundamental theology as a discipline by presenting a coherent vision of basic theological questions and positions that lay the ground for work in specific areas of systematic theology Rethinking Fundamental Theology examines central theological questions about God human experience and specifically religious experience the divine revelation coming through the history of Israel and through the life death and resurrection of Jesus human faith that responds to revelation the nature of tradition that transmits the record and reality of revelation the structure of biblical inspiration and truth as well as basic issues concerned with the formation of the canon the founding of the Church with some leadership structures the relationship between Christ's revelation and the faith of those

Mark Eyskens, 2022-06-22 This book was born out of a long standing frustration due to the observation that a societal silence prevails on existential questions which we dare not talk about even in our highly interconnected world As if an embarrassment has seized our interlocutors struck by a certain metaphysical prudishness as soon as conversation turned to talking about life and death the meaning of our existence or fundamental values and their divine or human origin Is there life after death and Is there life before death are questions that I have never heard raised at the Parliament bar or in a waiting room of the university faculties This book is the result of a reaction to the deficit of essential questioning at a time when digital and other forms of media inundate society This writing is not a philosophical essay nor is it a theological treatise a sociological manual a novel a collection of poems The truth is that it is all of these at the same time Hence the reader must browse the pages of this book with caution and prepare to encounter divergent intellectual landscapes planted with many question marks Furthermore since I will thoroughly discuss transcendence and what is hidden behind the visible and in the heart of the homo sapiens I had to appeal to allegories metaphors images and poetry Three allegories emerge most forcefully that of the homo interrogans the blind monk and that of the palimpsest three symbolic stories that try to unravel some signals of the mystery of being The first concerns the discovery made by an expedition of paleontologists in Africa of an anthropoid skeleton that thanks to the arrangement of the bones was buried in prehistoric times in the shape of a large question mark The second allegory is about a blind monk who knows the contents of all the books in the library and is apparently a visionary The third one is the story of the discovery of an old parchment in Jerusalem an enigmatic palimpsest the decoding of which could upset the understanding of our human condition Moreover a certain professor I C Mortal appears who can be considered as the spiritual twin of the author Life is a mystery to be lived and not a problem to be solved the sage Mahatma Gandhi taught us Yet in order to grasp the mystery it is necessary to ask the right questions Music
