Food hunting - Discuss with the class what they think are healthy foods and which are not, and be prepared to be surprised! Encourage the children to do a range of different healthy foods and have a healthy picnic. What can you include with seasonal foods for the children to describe the colour, taste and smell.

What counts as my five a day? - Use the [Foodwatcher](#) to look at what counts as one of your five a day.

Give the child an a selection of foods in groups and get them to categorise them into what fits one of your five a day and place them one of your five a day! They could then draw a line down the centre of their table and draw the different foods.

Food groups and portion sizes - Look at the different groups of food on the table. Give the children a selection of foods and get them to sort them into the food groups. The [watchdog](#) could be used for looking at different food groups.

Look at the different proportions with the help of the [portion and portion sizes](#).

Encourage the children to use their own ideas of food by looking at packaging and comparing the data.

Descriptive writing - Looking at images and food hunting get the children to describe the different healthy foods they have chosen. Get them to describe the taste, texture, smell, feel and look. Adjectives are key when it comes to describing the food so get them [adjective cards](#) to help them with their descriptions.

For the children to describe their own food they could use [adjective cards](#).

Spelling - Use the [spelling cards](#) to get the children to practice their spelling and to describe their healthy food.

Recipe writing - Get the children to think of their food as a recipe and write it as a recipe. If they do not already know them, get them to write a recipe for the food of a [recipe](#). If they are unsure of the recipe, you could check that they are following their own recipe for the food.

What's new? - These [recipe cards](#) help encourage the children to think about what they are and what they are not a good for their health and also bring a great writing activity. The first page asks them to look at the food they eat, and the second page asks them to compare a healthy food with their own.
