A Book I Value Samuel Taylor Coleridge, 2021-06-08 Coleridge is such a celebrity that many who have never read *The Rime of the Ancient Mariner* have a fair idea who he was and yet the common impression of him is not flattering He is typically seen as a youthful genius transformed by drugs and philosophy into a tedious sage It is time for a change of image *A Book I Value* offers a one volume sampling of Coleridge s encyclopedic marginalia revealing a figure more complex but also more humanly attractive clever curious playful intense than the one we are used to This book makes a convenient introduction to Coleridge s life the intellectual issues and contemporary concerns that held his attention and the workings of his mind The marginalia represent an unintimidating sort of writing that Coleridge famously excelled at often in books borrowed from friends *A book I value* he wrote I reason quarrel with as with myself when I am reasoning Unlike the complete *Marginalia* in six volumes arranged alphabetically by author this representative selection is chronological and footnote free with a contextualizing introduction and brief headnotes that outline Coleridge s circumstances year by year and provide essential historical information Our own cultural taboo against writing in books is slackening in light of new interest in the history of the book It will be weakened further by the extraordinary and now accessible example of Coleridge who was a remarkably shrewd but at the same time a remarkably charitable reader

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The Reader in the Book Stephen Orgel, 2015-10-29 The Reader in the Book is concerned with a particular aspect of the history of the book an archeology and sociology of the use of margins and other blank spaces One of the most commonplace aspects of old books is the fact that people wrote in them something that until very recently has infuriated modern collectors and librarians But

these inscriptions constitute a significant dimension of the book's history and what readers did to books often added to their value. Sometimes marks in books have no relation to the subject of the book: merely names, dates, prices paid, blank spaces were used for pen trials and doing sums, and flyleaves are occasionally the repository of records of various kinds. The Reader in the Book deals with that special class of books in which the text and marginalia are in intense communication with each other, in which reading constitutes an active and sometimes adversarial engagement with the book. The major examples are works that are either classics or were classics in their own time but they are seen here as contemporaries read them without the benefit of centuries of commentary and critical guidance. The underlying question is at what point marginalia, the legible incorporation of the work of reading into the text of the book, became a way of defacing it rather than of increasing its value: why did we want books to lose their history?
