Jakle, 2003 Illustrated with eighty vintage city postcards made between the turn of the twentieth century and through the 1970 s with the emphasis on the first four decades historical geographer John A Jakle turns his attention to early twentieth century nocturnal views of America s cities and to the role of the picture postcard in popular culture Postcard images the author writes offered important visual fixes mental templates for visualising cities the vista of a downtown street at night or a bird s eye view of a vividly lit downtown or the dramatic lighting of monuments and other architectural landmarks As a result the popularity and proliferation of the penny postcard influenced how Americans thought about cities as landscape displays
