

## NAEP Report Card: Geography

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## Explore Results for the 2018 NAEP Geography Assessment

In 2018, the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) administered the geography assessment to a nationally representative sample of eighth-grade students. The geography assessment was delivered on digital devices for the first time in 2018, as well as on conventional paper and pencil formats. It assessed students' knowledge and skills in three content areas (Space and Place, Environment and Society, and Spatial Dynamics and Connections) and three cognitive areas (knowing, understanding, and applying). Students also answered survey questions about their opportunities to learn and their engagement with geography in and outside of school.

### How did students perform in geography?

In 2018, the average geography score for eighth-grade students was 3 points lower compared to 2014. The 2018 average score was not significantly different compared to 1994, the first assessment year.
