Action research is a model of professional development where educators study student learning related to their own teaching, a process that allows them to learn about their own instructional practices and to continue to monitor improved student learning.

APPROACHES TO ACTION RESEARCH

Action research is a process that teachers can use in their classrooms to address instructional questions and challenges.



Individual teacher research

Focuses on studying a problem or issue within a single classroom.

The teacher who engages in individual teacher research may or may not have support from colleagues and administration to share.

Collaborative action research

Focuses on studying a problem or issue within one or more classrooms.

Teachers may collaborate and work together to study a particular problem in many different ways.

School-wide action research

Every faculty member of the school is involved in studying a specific issue identified from school data.
