Lesson 5.1: Understand Regrouping for Subtraction

When you subtract, you borrow from the tens place.

Example: $42 - 18$

Step 1: Subtract the ones. $2 - 8$ is not possible. Borrow 1 from the tens place. $12 - 8 = 4$.

Step 2: Subtract the tens. $3 - 1 = 2$.

Answer: $42 - 18 = 24$

Lesson 5.2: Solve Subtraction Problems

For money, help you know what to do to solve a problem.

Example: $27 - 18$

Step 1: Subtract the ones. $7 - 8$ is not possible. Borrow 1 from the tens place. $17 - 8 = 9$.

Step 2: Subtract the tens. $1 - 1 = 0$.

Answer: $27 - 18 = 9$
