Yunis Ali, 2013-10-08 This book deals with two different pragmatic approaches to textual communication i the mainstream approach followed by the Ash'ari s Hanafi s and Mu'tazili s ii the salafite approach followed mainly by the Hanbali s defended and elaborated by Ibn Taymiyyah One of the primary aims of the book is to explore and formulate several Muslim legal theorists' pragmatic theories communicative principles and linguistic views construct them in the form of models and set them within a general uniform framework Another aim is to reveal a corpus of information and data which though highly relevant to modern pragmatics is still unknown This study which can be seen as an extensive introduction to medieval Islamic pragmatics is the first attempt to examine the approaches followed by the Salafi s or the mainstream from a pragmatic viewpoint There has been no attempt to explain the principles and the strategies utilised by the medieval Sunni Muslim legal theorists in their account of how communication works and how successful interpretation is achieved Of course a lot of work has been done on different Islamic sects and their different positions over the interpretation of the Quran and Sunnah but these studies fall short of delving into the underlying communicative principles that motivate their differences over interpretation The author's formulation of the Muslim legal theorists' views is enhanced by setting up a reliable theoretical foundation and by delving into their underlying philosophical principles This involves relating the legal theorists' insights into interpretation and communication to their relevant ontological epistemological and theological outlooks and comparing these insights with their modern pragmatic counterparts

Heterogeneity in Word-Formation Patterns Susanne Mühleisen, 2010-02-03 Postulated word formation rules often exclude formations that can nevertheless be found in actual usage This book presents an in depth investigation of a highly heterogeneous word formation pattern in English the formation of nouns by suffixation with ee Rather than relying on a single semantic or syntactic framework for analysis the study combines diachronic cognitive and language contact perspectives in order to explain the diversity in the formation and establishment of ee words It also seeks to challenge previous measurements of productivity and proposes a new way to investigate the relationship between actual and possible words By making use of the largest and most up to date electronic corpus the World Wide Web as a data source this research adds substantially to the number of attested ee words It furthermore analyses this word formation pattern in different varieties of English British vs American English Australian English Due to the multiplicity of approaches and analyses it offers the study is suitable for courses in English word formation lexicology corpus linguistics and historical linguistics

World Building in Spanish and English Spoken Narratives Jane Lugea,2016-06-16 Text World Theory is a powerful framework for discourse analysis that thus far has only been used in monolingual Anglophone stylistic analyses This work adapts Text World Theory for the analysis of Spanish discourse and in doing so suggests some improvements to the way in which it deals with discourse in particular with direct speech and conditional expressions Furthermore it applies Text World Theory in a novel way searching not for style in language but for the style of a language Focusing principally on deixis and modality the author examines whether Spanish speakers and English speakers construct the narrative text world in any patterned ways To do so the frog story methodology is employed eliciting spoken narratives from native adult speakers of both languages by means of a children s picture book These narratives are transcribed and subjected to a qualitative text world analysis which is supported with a quantitative corpus analysis The results reveal contrasts in Spanish and English speakers use of modality and deixis in building the same narrative text world and are relevant to scholars working in language typology cross cultural pragmatics and translation studies These novel applications of the Text World Theory push the boundaries of stylistics in new directions broadening the focus from monolingual texts to languages at large

Figurative Language in Biblical Prose Narrative Andrea Weiss,2006-03-01 This study applies several linguistic approaches to the book of Samuel in order to investigate the defining features of metaphor and the way metaphor and other forms of figurative language operate in biblical narrative The book begins with an exploration of how to identify and interpret the metaphors in 1 Samuel 25 Next the metaphors in 2 Samuel 16 16 17 14 are compared with other tropes primarily metonymy and simile Then the notion of dead metaphors is challenged while examining the figurative language in 1 Samuel 24 An in depth analysis of the figurative language in these texts results in a better understanding of the mechanics of metaphor and a richer more nuanced reading of these stories their characters and language
