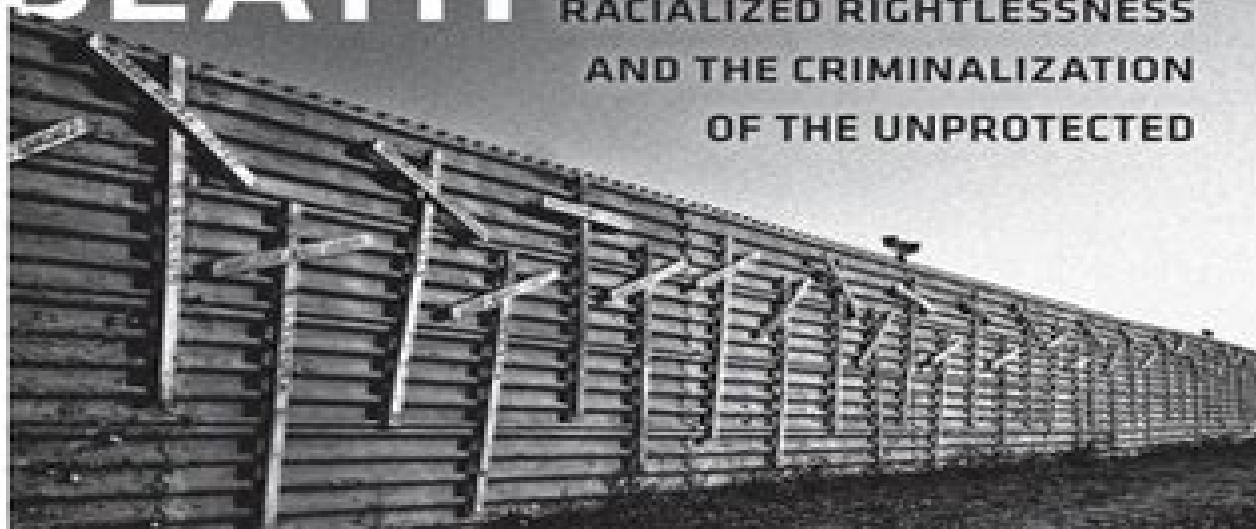

### **Lisa Marie Cacho Social Death:**

*Social Death* Lisa Marie Cacho, 2012-11-12 Winner of the 2013 John Hope Franklin Book Prize presented by the American Studies Association A necessary read that demonstrates the ways in which certain people are devalued without attention to social contexts Social Death tackles one of the core paradoxes of social justice struggles and scholarship that the battle to end oppression shares the moral grammar that structures exploitation and sanctions state violence Lisa Marie Cacho forcefully argues that the demands for personhood for those who in the eyes of society have little value depend on capitalist and heteropatriarchal measures of worth With poignant case studies Cacho illustrates that our very understanding of personhood is premised upon the unchallenged devaluation of criminalized populations of color Hence the reliance of rights based politics on notions of who is and is not a deserving member of society inadvertently replicates the logic that creates and normalizes states of social and literal death Her understanding of inalienable rights and personhood provides us the much needed comparative analytical and ethical tools to understand the racialized and nationalized tensions between racial groups Driven by a radical relentless critique Social Death challenges us to imagine a heretofore unthinkable politics and ethics that do not rest on neoliberal arguments about worth but rather emerge from the insurgent experiences of those negated persons who do not live by the norms that determine the productive patriotic law abiding and family oriented subject

*Prison and Social Death* Joshua M. Price, 2015-07 The United States imprisons more of its citizens than any other nation in the world To be sentenced to prison is to face systematic violence humiliation and perhaps worst of all separation from family and community It is to borrow Orlando Patterson's term for the utter isolation of slavery to suffer social death In *Prison and Social Death* Joshua Price exposes the unexamined cost that prisoners pay while incarcerated and after release drawing upon hundreds of often harrowing interviews conducted with people in prison parolees and their families Price argues that the prison separates prisoners from desperately needed communities of support from parents spouses and children Moreover this isolation of people in prison renders them highly vulnerable to other forms of violence including sexual violence Price stresses that the violence they face goes beyond physical abuse by prison guards and it involves institutionalized forms of mistreatment ranging from abysmally poor health care to routine practices that are arguably abusive such as pat downs cavity searches and the shackling of pregnant women And social death does not end with prison The condition is permanent following people after they are released from prison Finding housing employment receiving social welfare benefits and regaining voting rights are all hindered by various legal and other hurdles The mechanisms of social death Price shows are also informal and cultural Ex prisoners face numerous forms of distrust and are permanently stigmatized by other citizens around them A compelling blend of solidarity civil rights activism and social research *Prison and Social Death* offers a unique look at the American prison and the excessive and unnecessary damage it inflicts on prisoners and parolees

**Deported to Death** Jeremy Slack, 2019-07-30 What happens to migrants after they are deported from the

United States and dropped off at the Mexican border often hundreds if not thousands of miles from their hometowns In this eye opening work Jeremy Slack foregrounds the voices and experiences of Mexican deportees who frequently become targets of extreme forms of violence including migrant massacres upon their return to Mexico Navigating the complex world of the border Slack investigates how the high profile drug war has led to more than two hundred thousand deaths in Mexico and how many deportees stranded and vulnerable in unfamiliar cities have become fodder for drug cartel struggles Like no other book before it *Deported to Death* reshapes debates on the long term impact of border enforcement and illustrates the complex decisions migrants must make about whether to attempt the return to an often dangerous life in Mexico or face increasingly harsh punishment in the United States

Coleman, 2020-05-15 The Necropolitical Theater Race and Immigration on the Contemporary Spanish Stage demonstrates how theatrical production in Spain since the early 1990s has reflected national anxieties about immigration and race Jeffrey K Coleman argues that Spain has developed a necropolitical theater that casts the non European immigrant as fictionalized enemy one whose nonwhiteness is incompatible with Spanish national identity and therefore poses a threat to the very Europeanness of Spain The fate of the immigrant in the necropolitical theater is death either physical or metaphysical which preserves the status quo and provides catharsis for the spectator faced with the notion of racial diversity Marginalization forced assimilation and physical death are outcomes suffered by Latin American North African and sub Saharan African characters respectively and in these differential outcomes determined by skin color Coleman identifies an inherent racial hierarchy informed by the legacies of colonization and religious intolerance Drawing on theatrical texts performances legal documents interviews and critical reviews this book challenges Spanish theater to develop a new theatrical space Jeffrey K Coleman proposes a convivial theater that portrays immigrants as contributors to the Spanish state and better represents the multicultural reality of the nation today

**Against Abandonment** Ju Hui Judy Chun, Jennifer Jihye Chun, 2025-06-24 Across the world protest has become a much debated tactic in struggles against inequality political corruption and ecological disaster In South Korea protest is a ubiquitous and essential form of political

expression In 1987 mass protests forced reforms that led to democratizing government In 2017 the Candlelight movement removed the sitting president Beyond these spectacular national protests Korean workers and minority groups regularly turn to protest to express their grievances and assert their rights Based on long term ethnographic research with labor and social movement activists *Against Abandonment* is at once a chronicle of the life and death character of protesting precarity in South Korea and a searing examination of repertoires of solidarity for upending injustice Protest forms such as long term encampments life threatening hunger strikes and perilous high altitude occupations are agonizing to perform and to witness but often powerful as catalysts for change Chun and Han situate South Korean protest in transnational context to demonstrate how the struggles of South Korean workers are inextricably tied to the globalized conditions of neoliberal capitalism Building on the work of abolitionist feminist thinkers the book theorizes protest as a political form with far reaching resonance across history and geography and underscores the significance of collective survival self determination and emancipatory transformation

*Compulsory* Sabina E. Vaught, 2017-01-31 This is an American story unsettled by contradictions constituted by unresolvable loss and open ended hope produced through brutal exclusivities and persistent insurgencies This is the story of Lincoln prison In her Introduction Sabina E Vaught passionately details why the subject of prisons and prison schooling is so important An unprecedented institutional ethnography of race and gender power in one state s juvenile prison school system *Compulsory* will have major implications for public education everywhere Vaught argues that through its educational apparatus the state disproportionately removes young Black men from their homes and subjects them to the abuses of captivity She explores the various legal and ideological forces shaping juvenile prison and prison schooling and examines how these forces are mechanized across multiple state apparatuses not least school Drawing richly on ethnographic data she tells stories that map the repression of rightless incarcerated youth whose state captivity is the contemporary expression of age old practices of child removal and counterinsurgency Through a theoretically rigorous analysis of the daily experiences of prisoners teachers state officials mothers and more *Compulsory* provides vital insight into the broad compulsory systems of schooling both Inside prison and in the world Outside asking readers to reconsider conventional understandings of the role purpose and value of state schooling today
