God and Moral Obligation C. Stephen Evans, 2013-03-01 Is there a connection between religion and morality Ivan Karamazov in Dostoevsky's *The Brothers Karamazov* famously declares that if God does not exist then everything is permitted Most philosophers reject such a view and hold that moral truths do not depend on God C Stephen Evans argues that the truth lies somewhere between these two claims It is not quite right to say that there would be nothing left of morality if God did not exist but moral obligations do depend on God ontologically Such obligations are best understood as God's commands or requirements communicated to humans in a variety of ways including conscience In *God and Moral Obligation* Evans also argues that two views often thought to be rivals to a divine command morality natural law ethics and virtue ethics are not rivals at all but provide necessary complementary elements of a comprehensive morality A number of objections to a divine command account of moral obligations are posed and answered In the concluding chapters Evans points out the advantages such an account has over secular rivals The authority and objectivity of moral obligations are best explained by seeing them as divine commands

God and Moral Obligation C. Murphy, 2011-11-17 Does God's existence make a difference to how we explain morality Mark C Murphy critiques the two dominant theistic accounts of morality natural law theory and divine command theory and presents a novel third view He argues that we can value natural facts about humans and their good while keeping God at the centre of our moral explanations The characteristic methodology of theistic ethics is to proceed by asking whether there are features of moral norms that can be adequately explained only if we hold that such norms have some sort of theistic foundation But this methodology fruitful as it has been is one sided *God and Moral Law* proceeds not from the side of the moral norms so to speak but from the God side of things what sort of explanatory relationship should we expect between God and moral norms

given the existence of the God of orthodox theism Mark C Murphy asks whether the conception of God in orthodox theism as an absolutely perfect being militates in favour of a particular view of the explanation of morality by appeal to theistic facts He puts this methodology to work and shows that surprisingly natural law theory and divine command theory fail to offer the sort of explanation of morality that we would expect given the existence of the God of orthodox theism Drawing on the discussion of a structurally similar problem that of the relationship between God and the laws of nature Murphy articulates his new account of the relationship between God and morality one in which facts about God and facts about nature cooperate in the explanation of moral law

Divine Voluntarism Mi Young Nam, 2004 Divine voluntarism Divine command theory is a series of theories that claim that God is prior to moral obligation and that moral obligation is determined by God's will Divine voluntarism has to be formulated in a way that it does not have undesirable implications e.g. that moral obligation is arbitrary and that God's goodness is trivial Also while it avoids these undesirable implications divine voluntarism must not imply that God is in some way restricted by moral obligation which exists independently of Him Divine voluntarism can admit God's sovereignty over moral obligation and avoid making moral obligation arbitrary or God's goodness trivial by admitting various aspects of God's will Moral obligation is relevant to both God's will for human moral obligation and God's will for human moral good After all God's will for human moral obligation is God's willing that His own will for human moral good constitute moral obligation for humans

Free Will, Moral Responsibility, and the Desire to Be a God Bruce N. Waller, 2020-09-04 Free Will Moral Responsibility and the Desire to be a God explores the hidden corridors of the moral responsibility system to discover why that system is so widely accepted and passionately defended The moral responsibility system has obvious charms it provides justification for our powerful strike back motives transforms selfishness into the virtuous defense of our justly deserved special benefits draws a radical distinction between humans and the other species we exploit and protects our nonconscious belief in a just world Those charms notwithstanding the resilience and endurance of the moral responsibility system indicates a hidden force that not only binds together the pieces of the system but also motivates our stubborn devotion to that system That hidden force is a nonconscious desire to be a god a desire that afflicts both believers and atheists and that is almost universally denied Nietzsche being a special exception That desire can be found throughout the history of philosophy from Aristotle to the present It is also manifested in myths and a variety of religious practices and teachings The breadth power and harm of nonconscious apotheosis aspiration is the focus of this study

Evidence and Religious Belief Kelly James Clark, Raymond J.
