**PREÁMBULO**

Se inicia el siglo XXI con una nueva concepción y definición de la lectura y del libro. Durante siglos, el libro ha mantenido un formato singular y único, del mismo modo que se definía a la lectura como el ejercicio lector realizado por los individuos sobre los contenidos del mismo. En la actualidad, se concibe la lectura como una herramienta básica para el desarrollo de la personalidad y también como instrumento para la socialización; es decir, como elemento esencial para la capacitación y la convivencia democrática, para desarrollarse en la «sociedad de la información». La ciudadanía, a través de numerosos medios y recursos, recibe abundancia de información; mas, en este contexto, es preciso disponer de la habilidad necesaria para transformar la información en conocimientos, y esta capacidad se logra gracias al hábito lector. Sólo de esta manera los ciudadanos pueden aspirar a participar y disfrutar en igualdad de las posibilidades que ofrece la «sociedad del conocimiento»: leer es elegir perspectivas desde las que situar nuestra mirada invitando a reflexionar, a pensar y a crear.

La presente Ley de la lectura, del libro y de las bibliotecas nace, pues, dentro del marco que avala la Constitución a favor de los principios que promueven la convivencia. Surge como medida que atiende la pluralidad de matices que encierra el concepto de «lectura» y como reconocimiento de la diversidad de formatos que ofrece el concepto de «libro». Dado que es necesaria una adecuación a la nueva realidad, es preciso redefinir algunos conceptos esenciales, y ampliar el campo semántico de los mismos y que se imponen necesariamente a la nueva realidad, objeto de esta Ley.

This volume explores the literacy education master's degree program developed at Universidad de Guadalajara in Jalisco, Mexico, with the aim of addressing the nation's emerging social, economic, technological, and political needs. Developing the program required taking into account the cultural diversity, historical economic disparities, indigenous and colonial cultures, and power inequities of the Mexican nation. These conditions have produced economic structures that maintain the status quo that concentrates wealth and opportunity in the hands of the very few, creating challenges for the education and economic life for the majority of the population. The program advocates

providing tools for youth to critique and change their surroundings while also learning the codes of power that provide them a repertoire of navigational means for producing satisfying lives Rather than arguing that the program can be replicated or taken to scale in different contexts the editors focus on how their process of looking inward to consider Mexican cultures enabled them to develop an appropriate educational program to address Mexico's historically low literacy rates They show that if all teaching and learning is context dependent then focusing on the process of program development rather than on the outcomes that may or may not be easily applied to other settings is appropriate for global educators seeking to provide literacy teacher education grounded in national concerns and challenges The volume provides a process model for developing an organic program designed to address needs in a national context especially one grounded in both colonial and heritage cultures and one in which literacy is understood as a tool for social critique redress advancement and equity
