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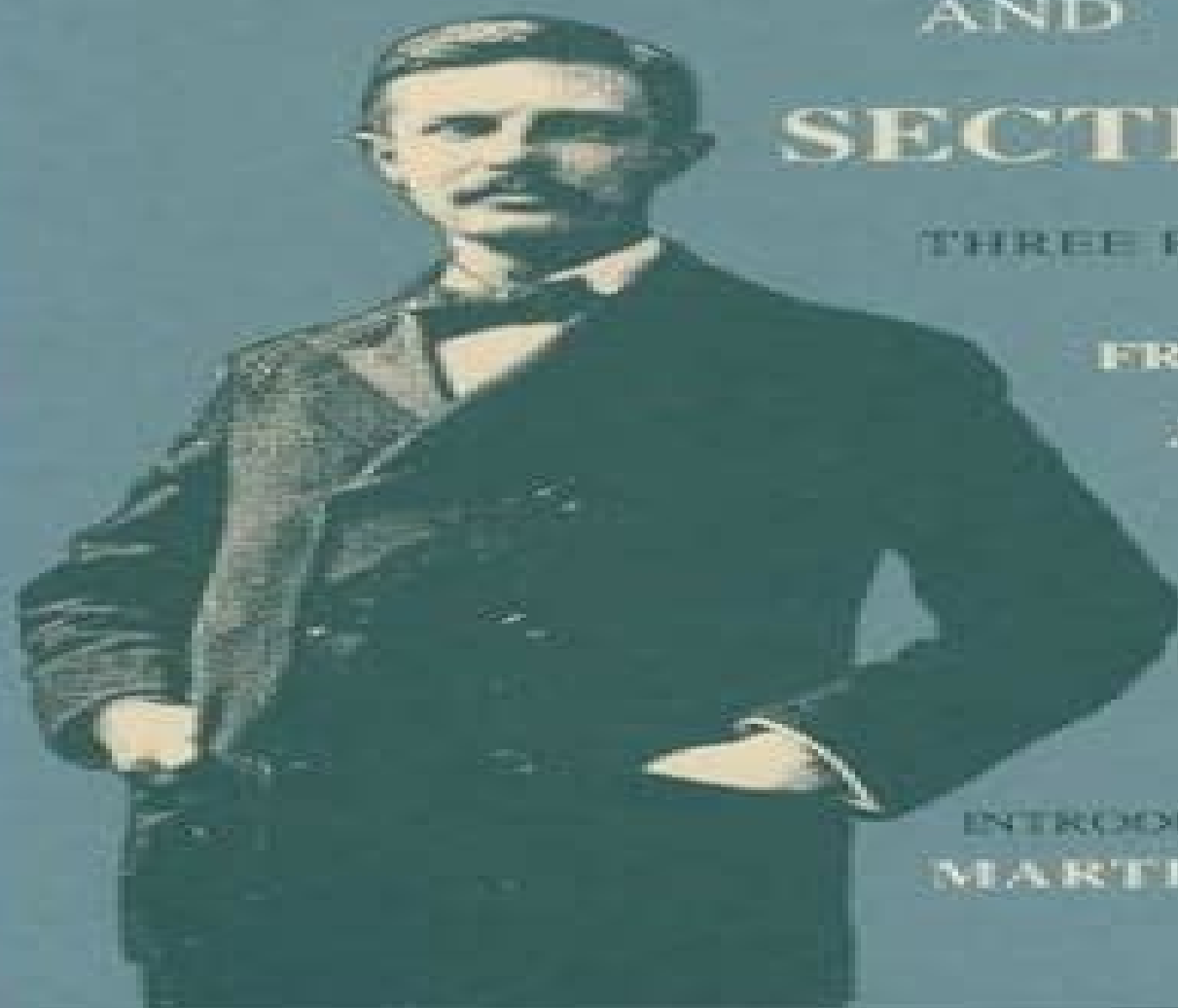

Revie, 2010-11-22 What is it about Niagara Falls that fascinates people What draws them to it Is it love obsession or fear In *The Niagara Companion* Linda Revie searches for an answer to these questions by examining the paintings and writings about the Falls from the late seventeenth century when the first Europeans discovered Niagara to the early twentieth century Linda Revie's study considers how three centuries of representations are shaped by the earliest encounters with the waterfall and notes shifts in the construction of landscape features and in human figures both Native and European in the long history of fine art depictions Travel narratives both literary and scientific also come under her scrutiny and reveal how these chronicles were influenced by previous pictures coming out of Niagara particularly some of the first from the seventeenth century In all of these portraits and texts she notes a common pattern of response from the observers moving from anticipation to disappointment to a kind of recovery But in the end there is fear Even long after Niagara had become a tourist mecca it was often drawn as a primordial wilderness a place where civilization vies with wildness artifice with nature fear with control the natural with the mastered Throughout this history of images and narratives as humans struggle to control nature the notion of wildness prevails Those who want a deeper understanding of why Niagara Falls continues to fascinate us even today will find Linda Revie's book an excellent companion

Spanish Louisiana Frances Kolb Turnbull, 2024-07-17 Frances Kolb Turnbull's study of Spanish colonial Louisiana is the first comprehensive history of the colony It emphasizes the Lower Mississippi valley's status as a borderland contested by empires and the region's diverse inhabitants in the era of volatility that followed the Seven Years War As Turnbull demonstrates the Spanish era was characterized by tremendous transition as the colony emerged from the neglect of the French period and became slowly but increasingly centered on plantation agriculture The transformations of this critical period grew out of the struggles between Spain and Louisiana's colonists enslaved people and Indians over issues related to space and mobility Many borderland peoples networks and alliances sought to preserve Louisiana as a flexible and fluid zone as the colonial government attempted to control and contain the region's inhabitants for its own purposes through policy and efforts to secure loyalty and its own advantageous alliances Turnbull first examines the period from 1763 through the American Revolution when the Mississippi River was a boundary between empires The river's designation as an imperial border ran counter to the topography of North America and counter to the practices of the valley's inhabitants who employed its waterways to trade communicate migrate and survive Turnbull pays special attention to the Revolt of 1768 the burgeoning trade along the Mississippi prior to the American Revolution that involved British and American merchants Spanish preparation for war and the crucial involvement of the borderland's diverse inhabitants as the war played out on the Lower Mississippi Turnbull then explains how the activity of borderland peoples evolved after the Revolutionary War when the Lower Mississippi was no longer an imperial boundary She

considers the instability and fluidity of postwar years in Louisiana American trade and migration Louisiana's experience of the Age of Revolutions from pro French sentiments to plans for rebellion among the enslaved and ultimately Spain's political demise in the Mississippi River valley

The Suburbs Marie Bouchet, Nathalie Cochoy, Isabelle Keller-Privat, Mathilde Rogez, 2022-02-01 While suburbs provide a rich field of research for sociologists architects urbanists and anthropologists they have not been given much attention in literary and cultural studies *The Suburbs New Literary Perspectives* sets out to enrich the limited existing body of critical analysis on the subject with a landmark collection of essays offering a far larger perspective than the books or collections published so far on the topic This interdisciplinary and wide ranging approach includes literary and art studies philosophy and cultural comment It examines the suburbs across cultural differences contrasting British South African and North American suburbs The specificity of this book therefore lies in a cross national and cross continental exploration of these uncharted territories The suburbs are redefined as those rebellious margins whose geographical borders are necessarily fuzzy and sketch out a common place where cultural frontiers can be transcended They are to use Sarah Nuttall's terminology places of entanglement where contraries meet and where new ways of being in the world is reborn Seen through the prism of art and literature the suburbs may then be recognized as philosopher Bruce B. Translating Property María E. Montoya, 2005-05-15 When American settlers arrived in the southwestern borderlands they assumed that the land was unencumbered by property claims But as María E. Montoya shows the Southwest was no empty quarter simply waiting to be parceled up Although Anglo farmers claimed absolute rights under the Homestead Act their claims were contested by Native Americans who had lived on the land for generations Mexican magnates like Lucien Maxwell who controlled vast parcels under grants from Mexican governors and foreign companies who thought they had purchased open land The result was that the Southwest inevitably became a battleground between land regimes with radically different cultural concepts The struggle over the Maxwell Land Grant a 1.7 million acre tract straddling New Mexico and Colorado demonstrates how contending parties reinterpreted the meaning of property to uphold their claims to the land Montoya reveals how those claims with their deep historical and racial roots have been addressed to the satisfaction of some and the bitter frustration of others *Translating Property* describes how European and American investors effectively mistranslated prior property regimes into new rules that worked to their own advantage and against those who had lived on the land previously Montoya explores the legal political and cultural battles that swept across the Southwest as this land was drawn into world market systems She shows that these legal issues still have real meaning for thousands of Mexican Americans who continue to fight for land granted to their families before the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo or for continuing communal access to land now claimed by others This new edition of Montoya's book brings the land grant controversy up to date A year after its original publication the Colorado Supreme Court tried once more to translate Mexican property ideals into the U.S. system of legal rights and in

2004 the Government Accounting Office issued the federal government's most comprehensive effort to sort out the tangled history of land rights concluding that Congress was under no obligation to compensate heirs of land grants Montoya recaps these recent developments further expanding our understanding of the battles over property rights and the persistence of inequality in the Southwest

Counternarrative Possibilities James Dorson, 2016-06-09 *Counternarrative Possibilities* reads Cormac McCarthy's Westerns against the backdrop of two formative tropes in American mythology virgin land from the 1950s and homeland after 9/11 Looking at McCarthy's Westerns in the context of American Studies James Dorson shows how his novels counter the national narratives underlying these tropes and reinvest them with new potentially transformative meaning Departing from prevailing accounts of McCarthy that place him in relation to his literary antecedents *Counternarrative Possibilities* takes a forward-looking approach that reads McCarthy's work as a key influence on millennial fiction Weaving together disciplinary history with longstanding debates over the relationship between aesthetics and politics this book is at once an exploration of the limits of ideology critique in the twenty-first century and an original reconsideration of McCarthy's work after postmodernism

Indian-Made Erika Bsumek, 2008-10-03 In works of silver and wool the Navajos have established a unique brand of American craft And when their artisans were integrated into the American economy during the late nineteenth century they became part of a complex cultural and economic framework in which their handmade crafts conveyed meanings beyond simple adornment As Anglo tourists discovered these crafts the Navajo weavings and jewelry gained appeal from the romanticized notion that their producers were part of a primitive group whose traditions were destined to vanish Erika Bsumek now explores the complex links between Indian identity and the emergence of tourism in the Southwest to reveal how production distribution and consumption became interdependent concepts shaped by the forces of consumerism race relations and federal policy Bsumek unravels the layers of meaning that surround the branding of Indian-made When Navajo artisans produced their goods collaborating traders tourist industry personnel and even ethnologists created a vision of Navajo culture that had little to do with Navajos themselves And as Anglos consumed Navajo crafts they also consumed the romantic notion of Navajos as primitives perpetuated by the marketplace These processes of production and consumption reinforced each other creating a symbiotic relationship and influencing both mutual Anglo Navajo perceptions and the ways in which Navajos participated in the modern marketplace Examining varied sites of production artisans workshops museums trading posts Bsumek shows how the market economy perpetuated Navaho stereotypes and cultural assumptions She takes readers into the hogans where men worked silver and women wove rugs and into the outlets where middlemen dictated what buyers wanted and where Navajos influenced inventory Exploring this process over seven decades she describes how artisans increasing use of modern tools created controversy about authenticity and how the meaning of the Indian-made label was even challenged in court Ultimately Bsumek shows that the sale of Indian-made goods cannot be explained solely through supply and demand It must also reckon with the multiple

images and narratives that grew up around the goods themselves integrating consumer culture tourism and history to open new perspectives on our understanding of American Indian material culture

In the Mean Time Erin Murrah-Mandril, 2020-04-01 The 1848 Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo which transferred more than a third of Mexico s territory to the United States deferred full U S citizenship for Mexican Americans but promised in the mean time to protect their property and liberty Erin Murrah Mandril demonstrates that the U S government deployed a colonization of time in the Southwest to insure political and economic underdevelopment in the region and to justify excluding Mexican Americans from narratives of U S progress In In the Mean Time Murrah Mandril contends that Mexican American authors challenged modern conceptions of empty homogenous linear and progressive time to contest U S colonization Taking a cue from Latina o and borderlands spatial theories Murrah Mandril argues that time like space is a socially constructed ideologically charged medium of power in the Southwest In the Mean Time draws on literature autobiography political documents and historical narratives composed between 1870 and 1940 to examine the way U S colonization altered time in the borderlands Rather than reinforce the colonial time structure early Mexican American authors exploited the internal contradictions of Manifest Destiny and U S progress to resist domination and situate themselves within the shifting political economic and historical present Read as decolonial narratives the

Mexican American cultural productions examined in this book also offer a new way of understanding Latina o literary history

A Familiar Strangeness Stuart Burrows,2010-03-01 Literary critics have traditionally suggested that the invention of photography led to the rise of the realist novel which is believed to imitate the detail and accuracy of the photographic image Instead says Stuart Burrows photography s influence on American fiction had less to do with any formal similarity between the two media than with the capacity of photography to render American identity and history homogeneous and reproducible The camera according to Burrows provoked a representational crisis one broadly modernist in character Since the photograph is not only a copy of its subject but a physical product of it the camera can be seen as actually challenging mimetic or realistic theories of representation which depend on a recognizable gap between original and reproduction Burrows argues for the centrality of photography to a set of writers commonly thought of as hostile to the camera including Nathaniel Hawthorne Henry James William Faulkner and Zora Neale Hurston The photographic metaphors and allusions to the medium that appear throughout these writers work demonstrate the ways in which one representational form actually influences another by changing how artists conceive of identity history and art itself A Familiar Strangeness thus challenges the notion of an absolute break between nineteenth century realism and twentieth century modernism a break that typically centers precisely on the two movements supposedly differing relation to the camera Just as modernist fiction interrupts and questions the link between visibility and knowledge so American realist fiction can be understood as making the world less knowable precisely by making it more visible
