Evidence-based practice is, as the name suggests, the idea that occupational practices should be based on scientific evidence.

OVERVIEW

Evidence-based practice requires a systematic approach to the translation of research findings into practice.

Supporters of evidence-based practice claim that it can to bridge the gap between research and practical application. Evidence-based practices distinguish between research that has immediate practical significance and research that doesn't.

EXAMPLES

- **Hand Hygiene in Hospitals:** This was implemented in the 19th Century after evidence it reduced mortality rates.
- **Play-Based Learning:** learning theorists in the early- to mid-20th Century presented evidence that play-based learning supports children's cognitive development, which has affected curriculum development worldwide.
