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Infanticide and Abortion in Early Modern Germany Margaret Brannan Lewis, 2016-03-17 This book is the first work to look at the full range of three centuries of the early modern period in regards to infanticide and abortion a period in which both practices were regarded equally as criminal acts Faced with dire consequences if they were found pregnant or if they bore illegitimate children many unmarried women were left with little choice Some of these unfortunate women turned to infanticide and abortion as the way out of their difficult situation This book explores the legal social cultural and religious causes of infanticide and abortion in the early modern period as well as the societal reactions to them It examines how perceptions of these actions taken by desperate women changed over three hundred years and as early modern society became obsessed with a supposed plague of murderous mothers resulting in heated debates elaborate public executions and a media frenzy Finally this book explores how the prosecution of infanticide and abortion eventually helped lead to major social and legal reformations during the age of the Enlightenment

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Suicide by Proxy in Early Modern Germany Kathy Stuart, 2023-07-24 Suicide by Proxy became a major societal problem after 1650 Suicidal people committed capital crimes with the explicit goal of earning their executions as a short cut to their salvation Desiring to die repentantly at the hands of divinely instituted government perpetrators hoped to escape eternal damnation that befell direct suicides Kathy Stuart shows how this crime emerged as an unintended consequence of aggressive social disciplining campaigns by confessional states Paradoxically suicide by proxy exposed the limits of early modern state power as governments struggled unsuccessfully to suppress the tactic Some perpetrators committed arson or blasphemy or confessed to long past crimes usually infanticide or bestiality Most frequently however they murdered young children believing that their innocent victims would also enter paradise The crime had cross confessional appeal as illustrated in case studies of Lutheran Hamburg and Catholic Vienna

Cultures of Abortion in Weimar Germany Cornelia Usborne, 2007-12-01 Abortion in the Weimar Republic is a compelling subject since it provoked public debates and campaigns of an intensity rarely matched elsewhere It proved so explosive because populationist ecclesiastical and political concerns were heightened by cultural anxieties of a modernity in crisis Based on an exceptionally rich source material e.g. criminal court cases doctors case books personal diaries feature films plays and literary works this study explores different attitudes and experiences of those women who sought to terminate an unwanted pregnancy and those who helped or hindered them It analyzes the dichotomy between medical theory and practice and questions common assumptions i.e. that abortion was a necessary evil which needed strict regulation and medical control or that all back street abortions were dangerous and bad Above all the book reveals women's own voices frequently contradictory and ambiguous having internalized medical ideas they often also adhered to older

daughters judges and defendants and prison authorities and inmates This book highlights much about the lived realities of nineteenth century Ireland
