guided reading tips

- Use assessments to guide and target specific skills and strategies.
- Suided Reading groups should be fluid and constantly changing, based on the needs of the students.
- Teach to the student's instructional reading level, which should be a little more difficult.
- Be an active listener, guide and facilitator, during each guided reading group.
- Celebrate errors and provide opportunities for a growth mindset!
