1. Student Learning Objectives:

State Standards [e.g. CCSS, NGSS, HGSS]

1.NBT.B.2

Understand that the two digits of a two-digit number represent amounts of tens and ones.

Understand the following as special cases:

1.NBT.B.2.A

10 can be thought of as a bundle of ten ones — called a “ten.”

1.NBT.B.2.B

The numbers from 11 to 19 are composed of a ten and one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, or nine ones.

1.NBT.B.2.C

The numbers 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90 refer to one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, or nine tens (and 0 ones).

Once a student fills five in a row, I will look over their chips to make sure they have placed them correctly.
