majority of the foreigners as well as of the natives are Congregationalists. The missionaries translated the Bible and other books into Hawaiian taught the natives to read and write gave the princes and nobles a high class education induced the king and chiefs to renounce their oppressive feudal rights with legal advice framed a constitution which became the law of the land and obtained the recognition of the little Polynesian kingdom as a member of the brotherhood of civilized nations With these few remarks I leave the subject of the volume to develop itself in my letters.
