Shaffer, 2012-12-06 One of the great advantages of rational emotive therapy RET and cognitive behavior therapy CBT is that they frequently employ psycho educational methods including bibliotherapy workshops lectures courses recordings and films I created RET at the beginning of 1955 after I had abandoned the practice of psychoanalysis because I found it to be highly inefficient and philosophically superficial Being almost addicted to one to one therapy as a result of my analytic training and experience I at first did RET only with individual clients and found this pioneering form of CBT considerably more effective than the other therapies with which I had experimented By 1957 however I realized that RET could be taught to large numbers of persons through self help books and articles and that RET oriented writings could not only prove valuable to the general public but that they could also be successfully employed to hasten and intensify the therapy of my individual clients I therefore wrote a number of RET self help books especially *How to Live with a Neurotic* 1957 *Sex without Guilt* 1958 *A New Guide to Rational Living* with Robert A Harper original edition 1961 and *A Guide to Successful Marriage* with Robert A Harper 1961
