Gura, 2013-04-09 From the acclaimed cultural historian Philip F Gura comes Truth s Ragged Edge a comprehensive and original history of the American novel s first century Grounded in Gura s extensive consideration of the diverse range of important early novels not just those that remain widely read today this book recovers many long neglected but influential writers such as the escaped slave Harriet Jacobs the free black Philadelphian Frank J Webb and the irrepressible John Neal to paint a complete and authoritative portrait of the era Gura also gives us the key to understanding what sets the early novel apart arguing that it is distinguished by its roots in the fundamental religiosity of American life Our nation s pioneering novelists it turns out wrote less in the service of art than of morality This history begins with a series of firsts the very first American novel William Hill Brown s The Power of Sympathy
