Protecting the World's Children: public health, human rights, capabilities, 2025-01-31 The safety and protection of all children now and in the future is of paramount importance for the well being of both humankind and the planet Currently the world's children are experiencing unprecedented levels of uncertainty and insecurity taking a significant toll on their physical and psychological well being The COVID 19 pandemic

caused widespread instability while inequity and injustice are becoming increasingly apparent. The rise of authoritarian regimes coupled with the devastating impacts of climate change as well as wars, civil unrest and loss of livelihoods have led to increased forced migration and exploitation of vulnerable populations. Furthermore, geopolitical developments as well as rising costs of living and fears of a global recession pose significant threats to the advancement of child rights. The highlighting of the profound impact of climate change, poverty, conflict and exclusion on the lives and protection of children makes it a timely contribution to the literature.
