- These goals are a generic baseline and can be modified to accommodate your individual client's needs, and the environment that you are addressing (i.e., school vs. medical setting.)

Sensory Motor	<p>By the onset of this IEP _____ or by the end of treatment _____ when provided with sensory challenges such as tactile brushes, proprioceptive input, visuals, tactile cues, movement breaks, minimize classroom disruptions, quiet games, Patient will attend and participate in classroom tasks as measured by data collection, and teacher/therapist observations.</p> <p>(Measurements) - Goal attainment will be measured by data collection, therapist, parent, teacher observation and progress reporting as well as successful completion of the objectives/benchmarks associated with the goal.</p>

	Category	Objectives
1.	Sensory Motor	Given daily multi-sensory stimulation for example tactile, auditory, and vestibular input Patient will produce at least one motor response (i.e. smile, eye contact, hand movement) given CDM to 75% of staff observations, 4/5 opportunities.
2.	Sensory Motor	Patient will participate in daily upper extremity game range of motion for both upper extremities without adverse reactions, on 4 out of 5 opportunities.
3.	Sensory Motor	Using sensory strategies, Patient will engage and participate in non-preferred activities within the classroom for up to 10 minutes demonstrating a calm level of arousal, 4 out of 5 trials observed.
4.	Sensory Motor	Using suggested accommodations, Patient will participate in non-preferred tasks including handwriting and/or circle time for 5-7 minutes with CDM 75% and on 4 out of 5 opportunities, on 3 out of 5 trials observed.
5.	Sensory Motor	Using sensory strategies, Patient will participate in classroom activities for 5-10 minutes, as well as transition routine and end of the classroom with a calm level of arousal, 4 out of 5 trials observed.
6.	Sensory Motor	Patient will demonstrate a calm level of arousal given sensory supports as needed evidenced by being able to sit and attend for 4-5 minute adult directed free motor activities task given observation on 4 out of 5 trials.
7.	Sensory Motor	When provided with proprioceptive (deep pressure) sensory input Patient will decrease the amount of non-preferred behavior such as _____ to successfully participate within classroom environment in a variety of settings, 3 out of 5 trials observed.
8.	Sensory Motor	Given visual/verbal cues and sensory strategies, Patient will accept transitions, both in and out of the classroom, 3 out of 5 times observed.
9.	Sensory Motor	When provided with sensory input, Patient will move through daily school routines without adverse reactions (e.g. kicking, flopping, tantrums, or bumping into obstacles) and/or on 4 out of 5 times observed.
