


To help you overcome your fear and master this really critical nursing skill, here are a few tips and tricks you might find handy.

DILATE THOSE VEINS!

- Cover the site with a hot moist towel
 Apply a nitroglycerin ointment to the insertion site
- Let the patient's arm hang down low
- Use alcohol wipe in the direction of the venous flow

PICKING THE RIGHT VEIN

- Check the vein by palpating
- Always palpate with the same finger
- Use the basilic vein as a last resort



START!

- Start the IV in the lowest vein
- Use the "two-step" technique to keep the veins from rolling
