Genebago, 2023-07-07. The Day of the Lord texts of Malachi (Mal 3:2-4, 5) demonstrate that he seems to allude to Joel's Day of the Lord (Joel 2:11-13, 31; MT 3:4). Malachi's Day of the Lord seems to have a strong inner biblical relationship with the Day of the Lord motif of Joel. A significant interpretive loss is committed when allusion is recognized in the source text but ignored and not explored. Thus, the passages themselves call for an inner biblical allusion study. In addition, the interpretive significance of Joel's Day of the Lord in Malachi has not been investigated comprehensively. As the review of literature and intertextual and inner biblical studies on Malachi validated, thus, these are the interrelated questions: a) What are the criteria to verify the inner biblical connection between Malachi and Joel on the Day of the Lord? b) How did Malachi use Joel's Day of the Lord motif? c) How did Malachi develop the Day of the Lord theme in his book? There are three purposes of this study. The first is to identify objective criteria to verify the inner biblical connection between Malachi and Joel on the Day of the Lord.

The second is to determine how Malachi used Joel's Day of the Lord motif. The last is to ascertain how Malachi developed the Day of the Lord theme in his book.

Mark 15:39 as a Markan Theology of Revelation Brian K. Gamel, 2017-10-19 In the Gospel of Mark Jesus arrest trial and execution ends with the Roman centurion who oversees the death process proclaiming Jesus as God's son. Gamel explores two key questions in relation to this moment: what does the centurion mean when he says that Jesus is God's son and why does he say it? The confession is not made on the basis of any signs nor from any indication that he perceives Jesus' death as honourable or exemplary. This apparent lack of motivation itself highlights a key Markan theme that this insight is revealed by an apocalyptic act of God signalled by the tearing of the temple veil. Thus the confession which we can understand to be made sincerely and knowledgeably is the result of an act of God's revelation alone. Gamel explores the theory of Mark depicting a story in which all human characters exhibit varying levels of blindness to the spiritual realities that govern their lives. By making a thorough examination of Mark's Gospel while placing primary focus on the centurion the study is unlimited and presents a serious examination of the whole Gospel. Gamel concludes his argument with the point that at the foot of the cross this blindness is decisively confronted by God's apocalyptic act. The offer of sight to the centurion demonstrates the reconciliation of God and humanity which are otherwise in Mark's Gospel repeatedly presented as antagonistic spheres. Finally the fact that revelation is offered to a Gentile highlights the inclusion of the nations into the promises of Israel.

Patristic Perspectives on Luke's Transfiguration Peter Anthony, 2022-03-24 Peter Anthony explores how visionary elements in Luke's Gospel had a particular influence on early interpretation of the Transfiguration by examining the rich

hermeneutical traditions that emerged particularly in the Latin West as the Transfiguration was first depicted visually in art Anthony begins by comparing the visual and visionary culture of antiquity with that of the present and their differing interpretations of the Transfiguration He then examines the Transfiguration texts in the synoptic gospels and their interpretation in modern scholarship and the reception of the Transfiguration in 2 Peter the Apocalypse of Peter and the Acts of Peter Tertullian and Origen Proceeding to look at interpretations found in the Greek East and the Latin West Anthony finally discusses the earliest visual depictions of the Transfiguration from the sixth century onward drawn from a wealth of different art forms Anthony concludes that early commentators and artists understanding of how we see and visualise and therefore how the Transfiguration was apprehended is closer to that of the writers of the New Testament than many modern interpreters is

philosophy **Politics in the Bible** Paul Abramson, 2017-09-08 The Bible is fundamental to Western culture Political philosophers from Hobbes Locke Montesquieu and Rousseau to modern political theorists such as George H Sabine Leo Strauss and Sheldon S Wolin have drawn upon biblical examples American political leaders such as Thomas Paine Abraham Lincoln and William Jennings Bryan all drew heavily upon the Bible Today most contemporary politicians display less familiarity with Scripture although many proudly proclaim themselves to be born again Christians Politics in the Bible has a simple goal to help readers to think critically about how the Bible illuminates understanding of justice leadership and politics For a political scientist there are great advantages to studying the Bible Students of the Bible have short texts to analyze but they have a history of two thousand years of Jewish and Christian scholarly discussion In that tradition Paul R Abramson analyzes stories drawn from eighteen of the thirty nine books of the Hebrew Bible and fifteen of the twenty seven books of the New Testament Abramson argues that the Bible is a book that should be read even by those who do not believe it has any transcendent significance One can choose to read it as the revealed word of God as a source of Western morality as a compilation of interesting stories poetry and history or as a work of great literature Although this book discusses selected stories that have political implications it also considers parts that have literary merit This unusual volume may stimulate new thinking about the Bible as a source of insight into political ideas Locating the Kingdom of God Karen J.

Wenell, 2024-08-22 This book offers a new multidisciplinary way of thinking about the Kingdom of God which fully recognises its sociological and spatial significance in performing boundaries of the sacred Though spatial critical perspectives have been increasingly recognised as important across many disciplines the significance of non physical religious spaces and their correspondence to boundaries of the sacred has not been explored fully and never using the specific example of the Kingdom of God Wenell considers the diverse and sometimes contradictory articulation of the Kingdom in the gospels as well as the ways that Kingdom language frames contemporary ethical debates Her study of the Kingdom is located within the wider study of religion affording the opportunity to investigate connections between space belonging and the sacred Wenell structures her investigation in four key areas that engage with the Kingdom in different but theoretically interconnected ways She begins by setting out a theory of sacred space that is capable of including the Kingdom and establishing key concepts such as boundary performance physical non physical spatiality spokespersons and controversy Wenell then focuses on the synoptic gospels and the origins of the Kingdom noting aspects of uncertainty as well as areas of agreement and controversy over boundaries of the sacred in these uniquely interrelated texts The third and fourth areas of investigation move into cultural reception considering instances where the Kingdom is formative for identity and ethical relationships both in individual and wider group belonging terms Specific reference is made to issues of ethical consuming and displacement placing the Kingdom in dialogue with Bauman s discussion of a society of consumers and Arendt s notion of equitable co habitation of the earth

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
