Homeless Children Panos Vostanis, Stuart Cumella, 1999-01-01 An increasing number of families are becoming homeless often as a result of domestic violence which leaves women and their school age children without homes This multidisciplinary volume is the first to look at the variety of problems encountered by this group and to propose strategies for managing those problems The contributors to this book provide evidence that homeless children often have more acute problems and needs than other children as a result of the insecurity of their situation they may experience physical health problems and developmental delay They are also at high risk of emotional and behavioural difficulties such as sleep disturbance eating problems aggression over activity anxiety depression and self harm At the same time due to their unstable situation they are less able to access support from the health education and social services Homeless Children defines the specific problems and needs of homeless children and draws up practical guidelines for staff and agencies on recognising and dealing with those problems It then looks at policy and service development for homeless families in education health and social care and concludes that conventional methods of provision have to be adapted to meet the specific needs of this vulnerable group The Impact of Homelessness on Children Linda Sullivan, 2023-07-28 First published in 1997 Presents the views of nine children ages seven to eleven on homelessness and how it impacts their lives All nine children resided in shelters reported violent and disruptive events in their past and did not consider themselves homeless citing the shelter as their home The education for homeless children and youth program learning to succeed. **Educating Homeless** Children James H.
