Egerton, 2009-01-13 In *Death or Liberty*

Douglas R Egerton offers a sweeping chronicle of African American history stretching from Britain's 1763 victory in the Seven Years War to the election of slaveholder Thomas Jefferson as president in 1800 While American slavery is usually identified with antebellum cotton plantations Egerton shows that on the eve of the Revolution it encompassed everything from wading in the South Carolina rice fields to carting goods around Manhattan to serving the households of Boston's elite More important he recaptures the drama of slaves freed blacks and white reformers fighting to make the young nation fulfill its republican slogans Although this struggle often unfolded in the corridors of power Egerton pays special attention to what black Americans did for themselves in these decades and his narrative brims with compelling portraits of forgotten African American activists and rebels who battled huge odds and succeeded in finding liberty if never equality only in northern states Egerton concludes that despite the real possibility of peaceful if gradual emancipation the Founders ultimately lacked the courage to end slavery *Genteel Rebel* Sheila R. Phipps, 2003-10-13 This elegantly written biography depicts the combined effect of social structure character and national crisis on a woman's life Mary Greenhow Lee 1819 1907 was raised in a privileged Virginia household As a young woman she flirted with President Van Buren's son drank tea with Dolley Madison and frolicked in bedsheets through the streets of Washington with her sister in law future Confederate spy Rose O Neal Greenhow Later in life Lee debated with senators fed foreign emissaries and correspondents scolded generals and nursed soldiers As a Confederate sympathizer in the hotly contested small border town of Winchester Virginia she ran an underground postal service hid contraband under her nieces dresses abetted the Rebel cause and was finally banished Lee's personal history is an intriguing story It is also an account of the complex social relations that characterized nineteenth century life She was an elite southern woman who knew the rules but who also flouted and other times flaunted the

prevailing gender arrangements Her views on status suggest that the immeasurable markers of prestige were much more important than wealth in her social stratum She had strong ideas about who was or was not her equal yet she married a man of quite modest means Lee s biography also enlarges our view of Confederate patriotism revealing a war within a war and divisions arising as much from politics and geography as from issues of slavery and class Mary Greenhow Lee was a woman of her time and place one whose youthful rebellion against her society s standards yielded to her desire to preserve that society s way of life Genteel Rebel illustrates the value of biography as history as it narrates the eventful life of a surprisingly powerful southern lady

The Society of the Cincinnati Markus Hünemörder,2006-02-01 In 1783 the officers of the Continental Army created the Society of the Cincinnati This veterans organization was founded in order to preserve the memory of the revolutionary struggle and pursue the officers common interest in outstanding pay and pensions Henry Knox and Frederick Steuben were the society s chief organizers George Washington himself served as president Soon however a widely distributed pamphlet by Aedanus Burke of South Carolina accused the Society of conspiracy According to Burke the Society of the Cincinnati was nothing less than a hereditary nobility which would subvert American republicanism into aristocracy Soon more critics including John Adams and Elbridge Gerry joined the fray claiming among other things that the Society was a secret government for the United States or a puppet of the French monarchy While these accusations were unjustified they played an important role in the difficult political debates of the 1780s including the efforts to revise the Articles of Confederation This book explores why a part of the revolutionary leadership accused another of subversion in the critical period and how the political culture of the times predisposed many leading Americans to think of the Cincinnati as a conspiracy

Atlantic Loyalties Andrew McMichael, 2010-01-25 Integrating social cultural economic and political history this is a study of the factors that grounded or swayed the loyalties of non Spaniards living under Spanish rule on the southern frontier In particular Andrew McMichael looks at the colonial Spanish administration s attitude toward resident Americans The Spanish borderlands systems of slavery and land ownership McMichael shows used an efficient system of land distribution and government patronage that engendered loyalty and withstood a series of conflicts that tested but did not shatter residents allegiance McMichael focuses on the Baton Rouge district of Spanish West Florida from 1785 through 1810 analyzing why resident Anglo Americans who had maintained a high degree of loyalty to the Spanish Crown through 1809 rebelled in 1810 The book contextualizes the 1810 rebellion and by extension the southern frontier within the broader Atlantic World showing how both local factors as well as events in Europe affected lives in the Spanish borderlands Breaking with traditional scholarship McMichael examines contests over land and slaves as a determinant of loyalty He draws on Spanish French and Anglo records to challenge scholarship that asserts a particularly American loyalty on the frontier whereby Anglo American residents in West Florida as disaffected subjects of the Spanish Crown patiently abided until they could overthrow an alien system Rather it was political social and cultural conflicts not nationalist ideology that disrupted networks by which

economic prosperity was gained and thus loyalty retained Revolutionary Backlash Rosemarie Zagarri, 2011-06-03 The Seneca Falls Convention is typically seen as the beginning of the first women's rights movement in the United States. Revolutionary Backlash argues otherwise. According to Rosemarie Zagarri, the debate over women's rights began not in the decades prior to 1848 but during the American Revolution itself. Integrating the approaches of women's historians and political historians, this book explores changes in women's status that occurred from the time of the American Revolution until the election of Andrew Jackson. Although the period after the Revolution produced no collective movement for women's rights, women built on precedents established during the Revolution and gained an informal foothold in party politics and male electoral activities. Federalists and Jeffersonians vied for women's allegiance and sought their support in times of national crisis. Women in turn attended rallies, organized political activities, and voiced their opinions on the issues of the day. After the publication of Mary Wollstonecraft's *A Vindication of the Rights of Woman*, a widespread debate about the nature of women's rights ensued. The state of New Jersey attempted a bold experiment for a brief time: women there voted on the same terms as men. Yet, as Rosemarie Zagarri argues in *Revolutionary Backlash*, this opening for women soon closed. By 1828, women's politicization was seen more as a liability than as a strength contributing to a divisive political climate that repeatedly brought the country to the brink of civil war. The increasing sophistication of party organizations and triumph of universal suffrage for white males marginalized those who could not vote, especially women. Yet all was not lost. Women had already begun to participate in charitable movements, benevolent societies, and social reform organizations. Through these organizations, women found another way to practice politics.
