on the Apocalypse ,2022-04-15 The Apocalypse or Book of Revelation is one of the most frequently discussed books of the biblical canon and arguably one of the most difficult to interpret This volume contains three texts as examples of late ancient Christian interpretation of its intriguing visions It also includes a comprehensive introduction to each text by its respective translator Brief Explanations of the Apocalypse by Cassiodorus c 580 translated by Francis X Gumerlock from Latin and published in English for the first time in this volume served as an introduction to the Book of Revelation for Cassiodorus's students at the Vivarium a monastery in southern Italy Cassiodorus divided the Apocalypse into 33 sections corresponding to the age of Jesus at his Passion and expressed his belief that John's visions were revelations of the end of the world including the Second Coming of Christ for judgment the defeat of the Antichrist the general resurrection and the arrival of the heavenly Kingdom Testimonies of Gregory the Great on the Apocalypse translated from Latin by Mark DelCogliano and also published here for the first time in English is a collection of 55 excerpts on the Apocalypse from the writings of St Gregory the Great d 604 compiled by an anonymous author Drawn mainly from Gregory's Moralia but also from his Book on Pastoral Care and homilies the excerpts which are arranged from Revelation 1:4 to 22:17 illustrate Gregory's grammatical exegesis of the Apocalypse his interpretation of various figures in the Apocalypse and his attempt to reconcile certain passages in the Apocalypse with seemingly contradictory texts from other parts of Scripture The anonymous Greek Scholia on the Apocalypse

contains 39 exegetical notes on chapters 1-14 of the Apocalypse which reveal influences of Origen and Didymus the Blind among others. The notes provide spiritual interpretations of the various passages and give attention to the interpretation of certain words that appear in the Book of Revelation. This new translation from the Greek by T. C. Schmidt utilizes all the Greek editions. Furthermore, its introductory matter contains updates on the Scholia from the latest scholarship and compares each scholion with interpretations found in various patristic authors, mainly of Alexandrian heritage. The Unity of the Proslogion John Bayer, 2021-09-20. Interpretations of Anselm's Proslogion range between the extremes of rationalism and fideism because of the challenge of unifying its philosophical and devotional aspects. In this book, Bayer argues that a monastic interpretation or an interpretation that takes seriously the intellectual significance of our existential commitments offers a powerful compromise. Through an extensive study of Anselm's spirituality, especially as it is manifested in his letters and homiletic works, coupled with a profound study of Anselm's philosophy of language in the *De grammatico* and *Monologion*, Bayer aims to reveal the Anselmian unity of life and thought and thereby also the harmony between faith and reason. The North Transept of Reims Cathedral Jennifer M. Feltman, 2016-07-15. This interdisciplinary volume in the AVISTA series is the first book to focus solely on the north transept of Reims Cathedral, the portion of the gothic building that served as the canons' primary entrance to the cathedral from their adjoining cloister in the thirteenth century. Despite the importance of its sculpture and stained glass, as well as its ritual use by the canons, the north transept remains one of the least understood portions of the cathedral in part because its sequence of construction is so complex, even improvised. Until recently, important archaeological evidence of the transept's substructures was unavailable. This is, however, no longer the case. The current volume presents this new subterranean evidence alongside careful studies of the stones above ground, analysis of the geometry used in the transept's design, iconographic and stylistic studies of its sculpture and glass, and extant medieval documents which record events bearing upon its construction. Essays by international specialists of the cathedral's archaeology, architecture, sculpture, and stained glass address issues of the north transept's evolving design and visual programs, thereby significantly clarifying and revising the building's chronology. Essays also consider the meaning of its visual programs in light of architectural adaptation and contemporary socio-historical events, whether royal coronations or the infamous revolts of the local burghers. Among the intellectuals of the Carolingian Renaissance of the ninth century few are as prolific and influential as Hrabanus Maurus c 780 856 a monk and abbot of the monastery of Fulda and then archbishop of Mainz Most famous among modern authors as the putative author of the hymn Come Holy Ghost Hrabanus was highly esteemed by generations of medieval intellectuals including Dante who located the archbishop among St Bonaventure s cohort in the sphere of the Sun This volume presents for the first time in English translation Hrabanus s pedagogical masterpiece On the Formation of Clergy De institutione clericorum Unveiled on the Feast of All Saints in 819 at the dedication of the great Salvator basilica Hrabanus work addresses the most important focuses of the Carolingian Renaissance education and ecclesiastical reform The treatise promotes a careful balance between classical training and Christian ethics and features the robust pedagogy of the early medieval monastic curriculum At points it even offers glimpses into the energetic environment of Fulda s classrooms On the Formation of Clergy also supplies a program for ecclesiastical reform It provides readers with a primer on ecclesiastical hierarchy and liturgy providing glosses on church offices and explanations of important church activities Hrabanus divided his opus into three books Book One explains Holy Orders It lays out the distinctions between clergy and laity enumerates the ranks of the priesthood describes clerical vesture and explores the sacraments Book Two examines priestly life It considers ascetic disciplines appropriate for priests at different grades describes expected prayer routines and identifies important doctrinal teachings and principal liturgical feasts Book Three treats biblical studies and preaching It lays out a curriculum for the liberal arts connects the liberal arts to catechetics and homiletics and integrates academic study with moral instruction On the Formation of Clergy was widely read throughout the Middle Ages Beyond its impact on the Carolingian Renaissance the treatise guided legal analysis in Gratian s Decretum supplied examples for Peter Lombard s Sentences and is cited by theological titans from Rupert of Deutz to Thomas Aquinas to Gabriel Biel

Meditation as Spiritual Therapy Matthew McWhorter,Matthew R. McWhorter,2024 Christian persons today might seek spiritual development and ponder the benefit of

mindfulness exercises but also maintain concerns if they perceive such exercises to originate from other religious traditions. Such persons may not be aware of a long tradition of meditation practice in Christianity that promotes personal growth. This spiritual tradition receives a careful formulation by Christian monastic authors in the twelfth century. One such teaching on meditation is found in the treatise *De consideratione* written by St Bernard of Clairvaux d 1153 to Pope Eugene III d 1153. In textual passages where St Bernard exhibits a clear concern for the mental health of the Pope due to numerous ongoing ecclesial, political, and military problems, St Bernard reminds Eugene III of his original monastic vocation and the meditation exercises associated with that vocation. The advice that St Bernard gives to Eugene III can be received today in a way that provides a structure for Christian meditation practice which is relevant for personal development, spiritual direction, and civil psychotherapy that integrates a client's spirituality into the course of treatment. St Bernard thus might be interpreted as a teacher of a kind of Christian mindfulness that can benefit both a person's mental health as well as a person's relationship with God. Meditation as Spiritual Therapy examines the historical context of Bernard's work, his purpose for writing it, as well as the numerous Christian sources he drew upon to formulate his teaching. Bernard's teaching on the course of meditation itself is explored in depth and in dialogue with his other treatises, letters, and sermons. Lastly, a contemporary summary of Bernard's teaching is provided with reflections concerning the relationship of this teaching to contemporary spiritual direction and spiritually integrated civil psychotherapy.
