believed that equally free and independent individuals constructed a voluntary union of equally free and independent states His son Henry Tucker 1780 1848 and grandson John Randolph Tucker 1823 1897 sought to defend this ideology of modern natural right against fellow professors North and South who tended to replace it with the ancient ideology of natural right the view that wisdom gives one the title to command Many southern intellectuals came to believe that individuals are not equally free and independent by nature many northerners came to argue that the states had never been equally free and independent These disagreements contributed to the outbreak of the Civil War At once a work of intellectual history that shows the key role played by professors in helping to formulate southern ideology as well as a recovery of rarely explored arguments this work wrestles with one of the greatest challenges of intellectual history the effort to understand the most controversial ideas of the past on their own terms while searching for the genealogy that connects the past to the present CHAD VANDERFORD is an associate professor of history at the University of Texas of the Permian Basin His articles and reviews have appears in publications including Civil War History the Journal of Southern History and the Virginia Magazine of History and Biography
