STAGE 1



**Shock, Denial and Loneliness**  
"This is not happening. I am so alone, no one understands."

STAGE 2



**Anger**  
"This is my fault. Why is this happening to me? This is not fair!"

STAGE 3



**Bargaining**  
"If only I had done something about it. What if we tried something different or done things differently?"

STAGE 4



**Depression**  
"I feel empty and numb inside. I feel nothing."

STAGE 5



**Acceptance**  
"They are not coming back and that is okay. I know I may still feel sad but I understand why I feel this way. It is okay to feel upset and angry sometimes."

STAGE 6



**Healing**  
"I have people around me who I can talk to. These people will support me when I need them. I can cope."
