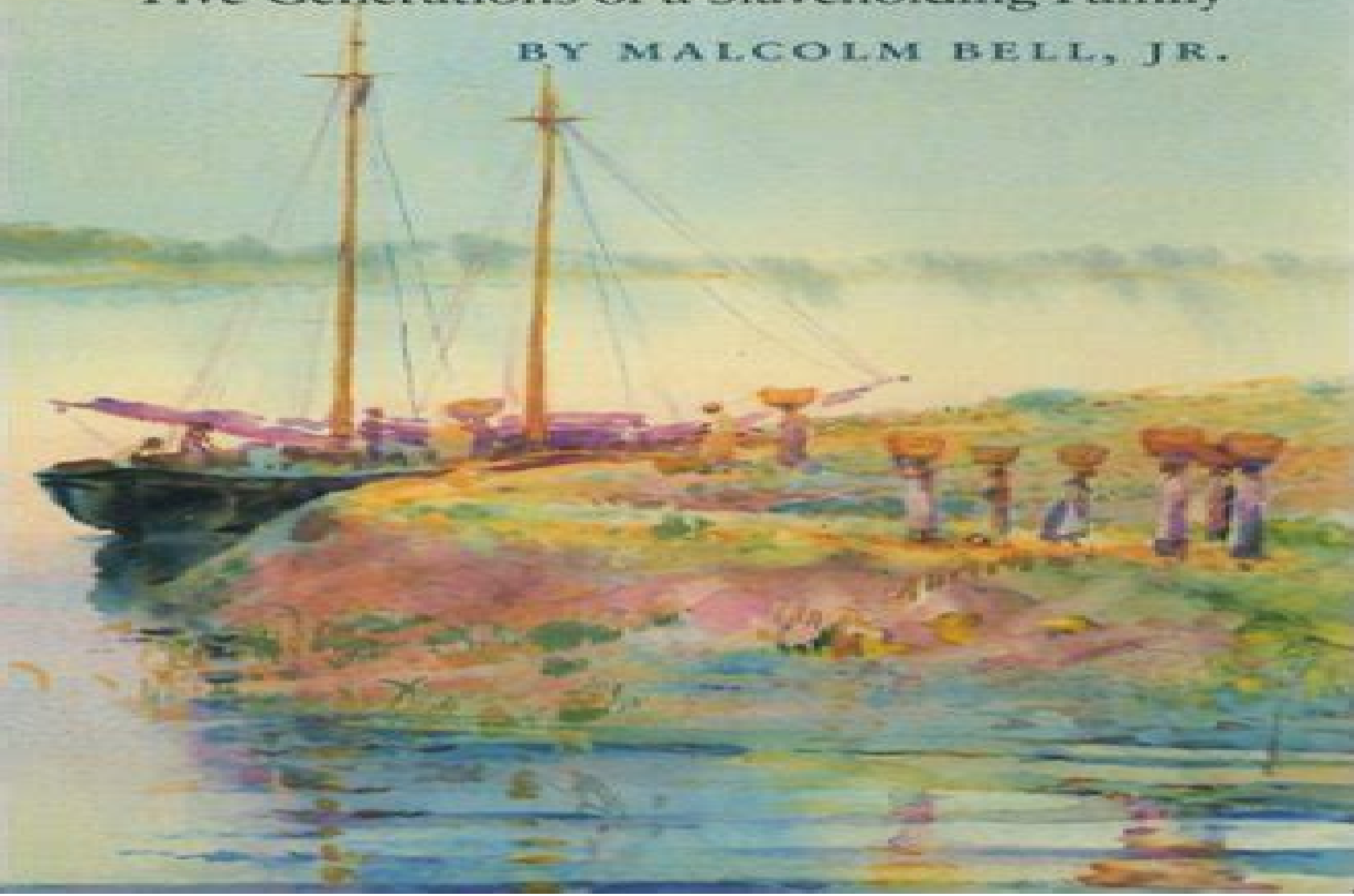

Murray, 2007 Alexander Hamilton America OCOs Forgotten Founder describes the character and achievements of a man who was instrumental in casting the form of our government and especially its strong financial structure His financial innovations renewed the public credit when war debts threatened to swamp the fledgling economy provided a stable currency system and established a federal revenue system Hamilton s involvement in the foreign affairs of the new republic assured its unity sovereignty and rapid economic growth Born in the West Indies Alexander Hamilton migrated to America when he was fifteen years old at a time when Colonial America was torn by political unrest with Great Britain He served in the Revolution as General Washington s chief aide de camp and as an officer in combat units He was a persuasive presence in the Constitutional Convention and helped to lead the subsequent ratification process Hamilton was a proponent for a strong central government believing that its direct influence over the people would strengthen the unity of the country As Secretary of the Treasury he understood that a strong financial system was essential to provide credibility and economic growth to the new republic He based his financial plan on the consolidation of the national debt and the adoption of a taxation system to service and retire that debt He promoted the chartering of the

Bank of the United States as the keystone to his financial plan Arguably the Father of Federalism Hamilton gave more to the structure and process of the United States government than any other single individual His opponents principally the Jeffersonian Republicans argued for greater sovereignty for state governments and sought to diminish the role of wealth in structuring and operating the financial systems of the country When it came the Civil War vindicated Hamilton s politics over Jefferson s view of a more tenuous and tentative union He authored the lion s share of The Federalist Papers writings which remain an important guide to the meaning and the intended function of the Constitution today Regrettably the hostility of his political opponents has transcended the country s recognition of the debt owed to this man This work introduces the general reader to some of the challenges and controversies of the early days of the Republic and highlights Hamilton s brilliant contributions to US policy and structure Hamilton promoted a vigorous national government to create a strong and unified country out of a mixed bag of 13 sovereign states This book was written for the broad cross section of American readers particularly those who while not having an abiding interest in history would welcome an interestingly written brief history of Hamilton s life and the great events surrounding the founding of the nation The book is also suited for high school and college level students of US history Most Americans today have little understanding of the character the life and accomplishments of Alexander Hamilton an extraordinary man by any account and an extraordinary American The current work intends to make his life and accomplishments accessible to a broader public *Lines in the Sand* Timothy James Lockley,2004-03 *Lines in the Sand* is Timothy Lockley s nuanced look at the interaction between nonslaveholding whites and African Americans in lowcountry Georgia from the introduction of slavery in the state to the beginning of the Civil War The study focuses on poor whites living in a society where they were dominated politically and economically by a planter elite and outnumbered by slaves Lockley argues that the division between nonslaveholding whites and African Americans was not fixed or insurmountable Pulling evidence from travel accounts slave narratives newspapers and court documents he reveals that these groups formed myriad kinds of relationships sometimes out of mutual affection sometimes for mutual advantage but always in spite of the disapproving authority of the planter class Lockley has synthesized an impressive amount of material to create a rich social history that illuminates the lives of both blacks and whites His abundant detail and clear narrative style make this first book length examination of a complicated and overlooked topic both fascinating and accessible

Legare managed Darien-area rice plantations, first at General's Island, then at Champneys. Nearby was Butler's Island, made famous by Fanny Kemble Butler in her antebellum *Journal of a Residence on a Georgian Plantation*. Legare also served as the clerk of the city of Darien during the first three decades of the twentieth century, maintaining detailed records of public business and documenting local commercial and civic affairs. Almost to the day of his death in 1932,

Legare kept a journal containing his observations and commentary on the development of Darien as a center for timber exports and the gradual decline of the rice industry South Carolina and Georgia led the world in rice production in the mid nineteenth century and Legare s detailed accounts of planting and management provide one of the outstanding contemporary sources for what was becoming a vanishing way of life in tidewater Georgia Legare s journals are a microcosmic history of Darien and its environs during a time that was perhaps the most compelling in the town s history The industrial development of Darien in the postbellum era was the essence of Henry Grady s vision of the progressive New South a factor not lost on Legare He reflects on the difficulties associated with rice planting Darien s soaring then plummeting fortunes with yellow pine timber prominent community members and the development of local railroads Legare records these developments against the larger backdrop of America as his journal contains many observations on contemporary national events Buddy Sullivan has placed the Journal in context with an introduction and comprehensive endnotes identifying the people and events referred to by Legare There is also considerable African American history in the volume as reflected both in Legare s writings and in the editor s introduction and supplementary notes
