Scott, 2022-05-30 This book offers the first multidisciplinary analysis of the wordless novels of American woodcut artist and illustrator Lynd Ward 1905 1985 who has been enormously influential in the development of the contemporary graphic novel The study examines his six pictorial novels each part of an evolving experiment in a new form of visual narrative that offers a keen intervention in the cultural and sexual politics of the 1930s The novels form a discrete group much like Beethoven s piano sonatas or Keats s great odes in which Ward evolves a unique modernist style cinematic expressionist futurist realist documentary and grapples with significant cultural and political ideas

in a moment when the American experiment and capitalism itself hung in the balance In testing the limits of a new narrative form Ward s novels require a versatile critical framework as sensitive to German Expressionism and Weimar cinema as to labor politics and the new energies of proletarian homosexuality

the Reconstruction era He wrote about political bosses jumping frogs robber barons cats women s suffrage temperance petrified men the bicycle the Franco Prussian War the telephone the income tax the insanity defense injudicious swearing and the advisability of political candidates preemptively telling the worst about themselves before others get around to it Among the stories included here are Jim Smiley and His Jumping Frog which won him instant fame when published in 1865 Cannibalism in the Cars The Invalid s Story and the charming A Cat s Tale written for his daughters private amusement This volume also presents several of his famous and successful speeches and toasts such as Woman God Bless Her The Babies and Advice to Youth Such writings brought Twain immense success on the public lecture and banquet circuit as did his controversial Whittier Birthday Speech which portrayed Boston s most revered men of letters as a band of desperadoes

**A Sand County Almanac & Other Writings on Conservation and Ecology** Aldo Leopold, 2013-03-21 Since his death in 1948 Aldo Leopold has been increasingly recognized as one of the indispensable figures of American environmentalism A pioneering forester sportsman wildlife manager and ecologist he was also a gifted writer whose farsighted land ethic is proving increasingly relevant in our own time Now Leopold s essential contributions to our literature some hard to find or previously unpublished are gathered in a single volume for the first time Here is his classic A Sand County Almanac hailed with Thoreau s Walden and Carson s Silent Spring as one of the main literary influences on the modern environmental movement Published in 1949 it is still astonishing today a vivid firsthand philosophical tour de force Along with Sand County are more than fifty articles essays and lectures exploring the new complexities of ecological science and what we would now call environmental ethics Leopold s sharp eyed often humorous journals are illustrated here for the first time with his original photographs drawings and maps Also unique to this collection is a selection of over 100 letters most of them never before published tracing his personal and professional evolution and his efforts to foster in others the love and sense of responsibility he felt for the land

*Locus Solus* Selen Ansen, Süreyya Evren, 2022-06-01 Arter initiated a new publication series ARTER BACKGROUND in 2019 to accompany exhibitions drawn from its collection which holds more than 1 400 works of art The fourth book of the series accompanies Locus Solus which brings together selected works from the Arter Collection with several large scale installations including site specific new productions with an aim to explore the idea of nature through the lens of facts fictions and emotions In the book excerpts of textual and visual contents selected around the ideas active in the curatorial process of the exhibition are complemented by new works produced specifically for this context While the exhibition curated by Selen Ansen deals with the ways in which nature and culture permeate and affect each other the
